

Honors College Information and Application

The Honors College at OSU provides many opportunities, challenges, and rewards for outstanding students. Honors sections of general education courses, special interdisciplinary honors courses, topical honors seminars, and individual honors projects enable students to enhance their learning experience in a “small college atmosphere” within a major university.

HONORS BENEFITS

- small honors classes (typically 20-22 students, and often smaller)
- instruction by excellent, experienced faculty
- wide range of honors courses
- special honors advising by Honors College personnel who have earned honors degrees themselves
- interaction with other outstanding students in a supportive environment
- Honors College awards, transcript designations, and special honors degree diploma
- you pay the same tuition and fees for honors courses as for other comparable OSU courses

HONORS COLLEGE AWARDS

Students may pursue three distinct honors awards at OSU, the General Honors Award, the

College or Departmental Honors Award, and the Honors College Degree. All three awards usually fit within the courses required for a particular degree and normally do not result in additional credit hour requirements beyond those needed for the degree. Grades of “A” or “B” are required for honors courses to apply toward these awards, and cumulative and OSU GPAs of at least 3.50 are required to receive the awards.

The *General Honors Award* is a 21-honorscredit-hour award earned while completing your general education requirements. A breadth requirement provides honors experience in a variety of areas.

The *College or Departmental Honors Award* requires 12 honors credit hours earned in upper-division courses in your major field of study. This includes a senior honors thesis or creative component.

The *Honors College Degree* is earned by completing a minimum of 39 honors credit

hours, including the General Honors Award and the College or Departmental Honors Award. The Honors College Degree is the highest undergraduate academic award granted at OSU.

HONORS PRIVILEGES

By successfully taking at least six honors hours per semester and twelve honors hours in two consecutive semesters (three hours per semester for juniors and seniors) you earn a number of privileges relating to your honors education. These privileges include:

- use of the Honors College Study Lounge and Computer Lab
- early enrollment for the following semester
- extended library check-out privileges (equivalent to those of graduate students)
- the option to live in honors housing within Stout Hall, with central location, special academic and social

functions, and resident assistants who are all honors students. (Space is limited.)

ELIGIBILITY

Initial Eligibility for New Freshmen

- ACT Composite Score of 27 or higher [SAT Total Score of 1220 (critical reading and math) or higher] AND a high school GPA of 3.75 or higher
- Eligibility for Transfer Students**
- fewer than 60 credit hours = 3.30 cumulative grade point average
- 60-93 credit hours = 3.40 cumulative grade point average
- 94 or more credit hours = 3.50 cumulative grade point average

TRANSFER CREDIT

Up to 15 honors credit hours from other colleges and universities may be used toward the requirements for the General Honors Award.
